

### LEGAL ISSUES SURROUNDING BRAIN DEATH

My mother-in-law's advance health care directive has an interesting addendum. "Just be sure I'm really dead," it reads, "before you take anything out of my house!!" This statement, while possibly facetious, raises the question of how we know that someone is "really dead."

We are all familiar with death as determined by the cessation of heartbeat and respiration. With advances in medical science, however, this clinical death has become reversible in some instances. The brain survives for minutes after the heart stops, so the early application of CPR can resuscitate otherwise healthy individuals. Thus, we see changes in the way we define death.

Medical advances involving the transplantation of organs from deceased patients into living recipients have also affected the definition of death. To confirm death while preserving transplantable organs, the President's Commission for the Study of Ethical Problems in Medicine and Biomedical and Behavioral Research in 1981 proposed a new definition of death and recommended its adoption throughout the country. The revised definition of death is: "An individual who has sustained either (1) irreversible cessation of circulatory and respiratory functions, or (2) irreversible cessation of all functions of the entire brain, including the brain stem, is dead." Subsequently, the concept of brain death, or death determined by neurologic criteria, was codified and adopted by all 56 U.S. jurisdictions. While brain death accounts for only 1-2% of all in-hospital deaths, use of this term has raised multiple issues, both legal and ethical.

Because of the way we talk about brain death, the public seems to think that it is different from actual death. This is not the case. A person declared dead by neurologic criteria is dead. The person is no longer alive and has no possibility of ever living again.

Part of the confusion may be that there are other conditions that include profound unconsciousness. In a coma, a patient cannot be awakened and has no voluntary actions but may regain consciousness at some future time. A persistent vegetative state is also a deep state of unconsciousness, but the patient is alive and maintains some brain function.

In brain death, the person has no brain function. Brain death is determined by the lack of response to voice, pain, or other stimuli, lack of breathing, lack of reflexes, and lack of brain wave activity to stimuli. In California, a family does not need to consent to this determination, but it must be independently confirmed by another physician. The time of the second declaration is considered the legal time of death.

Once a person has been declared dead by either criteria, that person is no longer a patient, and the hospital has no responsibility for treatment. The appropriate action is to harvest the organs if indicated, remove all medical equipment, and release the body. Families may object, however. Recently, in *Avila v. ARMC*, the family of a young mother obtained a TRO to keep Anaheim Regional Medical Center from removing a ventilator after she was declared brain dead. When the diagnosis was confirmed by their own neurologist, however, the family consented to its removal.

Unfortunately, in covering such highly visible cases the media often speak of keeping brain dead patients "alive." In the noted case of Jahi McMath, the teenager who was declared brain dead after complications from a tonsillectomy, her family refused to accept the diagnosis of brain death and insisted that life support be continued so that God could heal her. They eventually succeeded in moving Jahi to a facility in New Jersey, where she remains on a ventilator. It is significant that New Jersey is the only state in which a physician is prohibited from declaring a patient brain dead if the family has religious objections to such a declaration. Much like Schrödinger's cat, then, Jahi McMath is currently both dead in California and alive in New Jersey.

Since some families need time to accept the diagnosis of brain death, California Health & Safety Code § 1254.4l mandates that hospitals adopt a policy to allow a "reasonably brief period" for the family of a person declared dead by neurological criteria to gather before removing previously ordered cardiopulmonary support. This "reasonably brief period" has not been defined, but it is generally understood to involve hours, not

needed much more than one film every few years. Then I connected with a lady who was creating a web channel that features only positive media. I have been working with her for almost two years now.



days. The statute also reads, "in determining what is reasonable, a hospital shall consider the needs of other patients and prospective patients in urgent need of care."

Thus, a person declared brain dead might continue on a ventilator for a period of time to allow the family to say their good-byes or to maintain the function of transplantable organs. Beyond these considerations, however, there is no legal mandate to continue so-called life support. That being the case, hospitals still struggle to balance professional standards and the care of other patients with respect for the family's wishes.

The issues surrounding brain death are not all legal. This area of law has been settled for decades, but there are always human and ethical issues to consider. To continue treatment after a patient has been declared dead is to offer medically futile treatment, which is unethical, but to withdraw a ventilator against the family's wishes is also problematic and seems cruel. The California "reasonable accommodations" statute is meant to address this dilemma. Using this guideline, some hospitals have opted to delay the withdrawal of cardiopulmonary support until the family can come to terms with the diagnosis or, as in the case of Lisa Avila, obtain independent verification of the diagnosis. In cases where the family continues to reject the reality that the patient has died, some hospitals may also choose to transfer the patient to another facility, as was the case with Jahi McMath.

There are few good options in such cases, and since they are always heart wrenching, it is unlikely that issues over brain death will be resolved in the foreseeable future.
