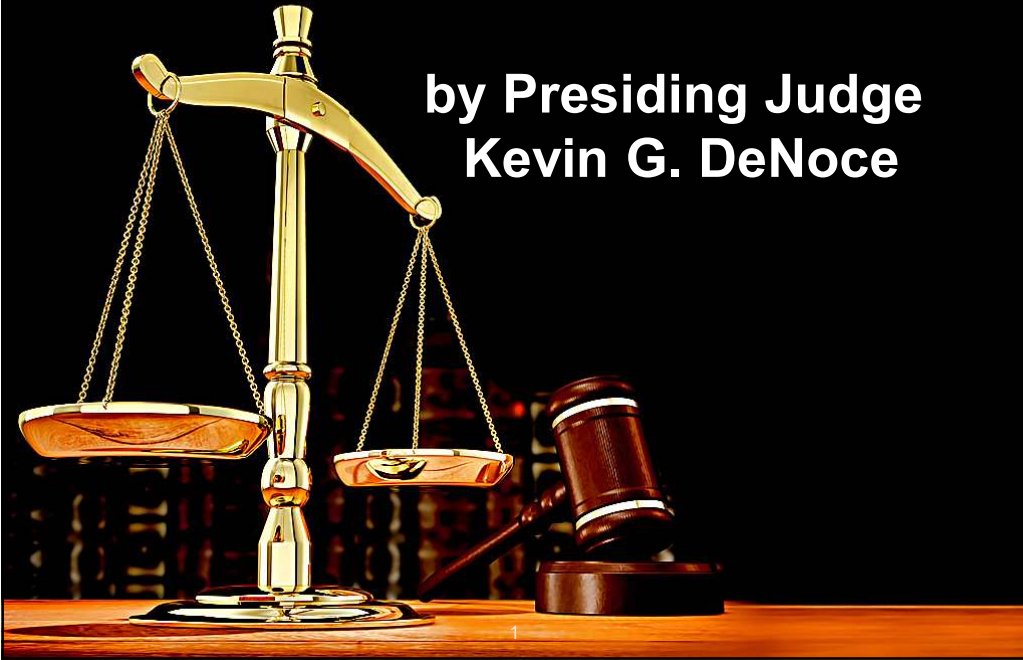

Changes on our Court

Case Volume Status

- **There are about 2,000 judicial officers in California which process over 4 million cases statewide.**
- **In comparison, the federal judicial system has only about 870 judges.**
- **Ventura County Judges & Commissioners have one of the highest case to bench officer ratios in the state in that there are over 3,000 filed case per bench officer.**

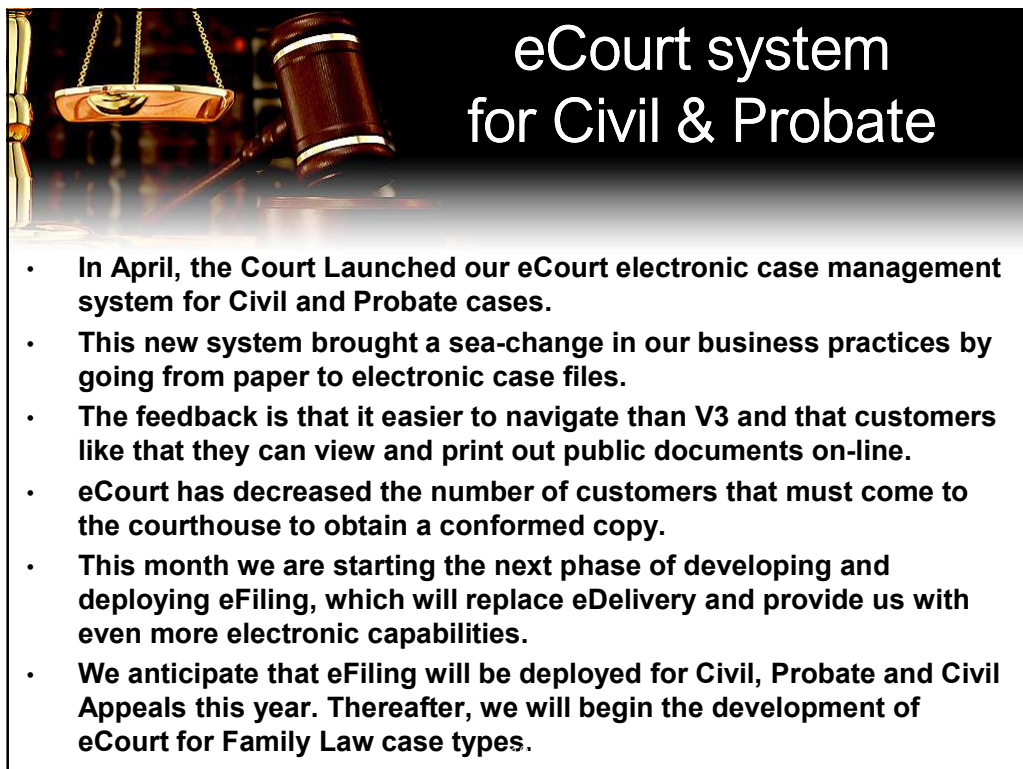

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eCourt system for Civil & Probate

- In April, the Court Launched our eCourt electronic case management system for Civil and Probate cases.
- This new system brought a sea-change in our business practices by going from paper to electronic case files.
- The feedback is that it easier to navigate than V3 and that customers like that they can view and print out public documents on-line.
- eCourt has decreased the number of customers that must come to the courthouse to obtain a conformed copy.
- This month we are starting the next phase of developing and deploying eFiling, which will replace eDelivery and provide us with even more electronic capabilities.
- We anticipate that eFiling will be deployed for Civil, Probate and Civil Appeals this year. Thereafter, we will begin the development of eCourt for Family Law case types.

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Role of the Presiding Judge

- **The PJ determines judicial assignments and who the Supervising Judges are for each division: Criminal: J. Wright; Civil: J. Coats; FL: J. Johnson; Juvenile: J. Romero.**
- **Acts as the spokesperson for the Court, issues press releases, etc;**
- **Apportions the business of the court, including assigning cases;**
- **Authorizes expenditures from the court's budget;**
- **Calls meetings of the Judges.**

Jury Trial Backlog?

- **We have no jury trial backlog in Civil.**
- **We recently started bring in new jurors in the morning and afternoon which has helped with juror moral and jury availability for trials.**
- **Although Criminal does not have a juror shortage problem it does occasionally have a last day issues.**

Mandatory Settlement Conferences

- I handle all the MSCs which are primarily done via Zoom.
- We try to schedule MSCs 60 – 90 days before trial – after discovery completed but before trial investment. Will do MSCs earlier upon request.
- 5 days prior to an MSC, the parties are required to submit their MSC brief and MSC form which explains the rules applicable to the Zoom MSC including confidentiality. Make sure your clients sign the form agreeing to the rules and the confidentiality of the proceeding.
- If I cannot broker a settlement, I will often make a recommended settlement in writing by way of email.

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Mandatory Settlement Conferences

(Best practices for counsel.)

- Make sure you submit your MSC brief at least 5 days prior to the MSC along with the Zoom MSC rules signed by yourself and client.
- If the case is not ripe for settlement, do not assume that you are stuck with that date and cannot continue it. I want to conduct an MSC when it is ripe for settlement.
- Talk with your clients before the MSC as to potential new offers/demands and what their settlement range is. I conduct MSCs where it is clear that counsel has not had sufficient discussions with their client about what offer or demand they wish to make which results in me having to pause the MSC so they can speak with their client.

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Mandatory Settlement Conferences

(Best practices for counsel, continued.)

- **Make sure that in advance of the MSC you think about all the potential settlement terms you want such as a Civil Code section 1542 waiver, each side will bear their own attorney fees and costs, Plaintiff(s) to be responsible for the payment of any outstanding medical bills and liens, interest accrual for late payment, etc.**
- **If the parties cannot agree on a settlement, consider inviting me to make a recommendation. Make sure you give me enough factual detail in your MSC brief and comments so that I can make an informed recommended settlement.**

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Mandatory Settlement Conferences

(Court recommended settlements.)

- **If an agreed upon settlement cannot be reached, I inquire if the parties want me to make a recommended settlement which I do by email after drafting a proposal with CCP section 664.6 language.**
- **When I make a suggested settlement, I email it to each party separately and typically give them a week to respond. Each side responds only to the court. That way, the parties do not know how the other side responded unless each side accepts my recommended settlement.**
- **Once a settlement has been reached, to make it CCP section 664.6 enforceable, we can go back on the record via Zoom to memorialize it or the parties can draft a written agreement. I created a fill in the blank settlement form which is on the court's web page.**

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Criminal Update

- We are down two bench officers in criminal and are hoping to get a new appointed judge soon that I can assign to the Criminal Dept.
- We will be selecting a new Commissioner soon which I will assign to Criminal.
- Our Court Reporter shortage is still impacting Criminal and to a lesser degree, Family Law & Civil.
- A fully staffed Court Reporter Dept. consists of 28 reporters. At present, the Court has only 14 full time reporters and three (3) part time reporters currently working.
- Criminal is also dealing with a high number of re-sentencings created by recent legislation.
