Artificial Intelligence and the Practice of Law in Ventura County: Navigating the Future



BARRISTERS' CORNER JULIA SNYDER- JUDGE-ELECT

Judge-elect Julia Snyder, currently serving as a Ventura County Superior Court Commissioner, was recently elected to fill a 2025 Ventura County Superior Court seat. As law students on the Barristers' Board, we interviewed Snyder about her victory in the recent election.

By way of background, **Judge Henry Walsh** will not run for election this year, leaving his position open. Snyder faced off against **Edward Andrews**, **Mike Malak**, and **John McBride** to fill Judge Walsh's seat. She garnered over 50% of votes and will officially be sworn in to the bench on January 6, 2025.

Born in Encino and raised in Thousand Oaks, Snyder knew since eighth grade that she wanted to be a judge. Her passion for law was ignited during lively debates hosted by her English teacher. Snyder light-heartedly jokes about always having something to say during these spontaneous discussions and her pre-teen aspirations to become an attorney. With grit and determination, Snyder's ambitions have become a reality.

Snyder attended Southwestern Law School, interned with the district attorney's office, then passed the California Bar Examination. Snyder raised three children while accomplishing her career and educational goals. For nearly two decades, Snyder served her community as a Deputy District Attorney in the felony crime division. During Snyder's last few years as a prosecutor, she worked full-time in a trial assignment and obtained a master's degree. Now, she performs the duties of Superior Court Commissioner and teaches as an adjunct professor at the Ventura campus of The Colleges of Law.

Ventura County Superior Court judges unanimously appointed Snyder as Commissioner, recognizing her extensive resume and compelling demeanor. Snyder exemplifies the qualities of a good judge. She commands respect, exuding an assertive yet joyful presence. She is compassionate and understanding yet firm and sensible. According to Snyder, "Demeanor is key... A judge must be open-minded, willing to listen, fair, and calm because there are people who will challenge your judicial temperament." Snyder admires Judge Patty Murphy (Ret.), describing her as a deliberative, humble judge she hopes to emulate.

Snyder speaks fondly of all the judges she serves with and their collegiality. Ventura County judges regularly meet for lunch, sharing their daily experiences and courtroom observations. She describes Ventura County as having an amicable, team-like atmosphere behind the bench.

Snyder's advice for new attorneys and law students is invaluable. She reminds us that with hard work and determination, we can achieve our goals. She advises, "In addition to being honest, ethical, and fair, your work ethic is a huge part of your reputation and something that we [judges] talk about often." According to Snyder, civility, professionalism, and a robust work ethic are key components to maintaining an esteemed reputation (and avoiding notoriety) among Ventura County judges. Practicing in a small community can be beneficial if one is diligent and respectful. As aspiring attorneys, we admire Snyder's tenacity, commitment to unbiased adjudication, and applaud her dedication to the Ventura County community. We look forward to seeing Judge Snyder on the bench in 2025.

Judge Worley Retires

Judge David Worley retired on May 20, 2024 from the Superior Court of California, County of Ventura after more than 17 years of dedicated service.

Worley was appointed by former Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger on May 16, 2008, and was administered the oath of office the same day, filling the vacancy created by the retirement of **Judge Thomas Hutchins**. Prior to his judicial appointment, Worley was selected in 2007 as a Court Commissioner by the judges of the Ventura Superior Court and served in that position until his judicial appointment. During his tenure as a judicial officer Worley was assigned to civil, criminal and juvenile matters, and he also served as a Supervising Judge of the Simi Valley Courthouse.

Before he joined the Ventura Superior Court, Worley worked in private practice from 1984 to 2007. From 1981 through 1984, he served as a deputy district attorney for the Ventura County District Attorney's Office.

Notable honors include Worley receiving the Knights of Columbus Council #750 Public Safety Award (2019) in recognition of his public safety contributions to the community.

Worley graduated with honors from California State College at Bakersfield. He also attended the United States Military Academy at West Point. He earned his Juris Doctorate degree from Loyola University of Los Angeles.



Judge Hernandez takes the Bench

Judge Ethel R. Hernandez took the bench on Monday, May 13, 2024, as Ventura County's newest Superior Court Judge. The Honorable Marine Dermadzhyan administered Hernandez's judicial oath of office. Hernandez was appointed by Governor Gavin Newsom on May 3, 2024. She fills the vacancy created by the retirement of Judge Bruce A. Young in December 2023. Prior to her appointment, Hernandez was a senior deputy district attorney for the Ventura County District Attorney's Office. Her most recent assignment was prosecuting narcotics sales cases, which involved close collaboration with law enforcement agencies in complex investigations. Before joining the Ventura DA's Office, Hernandez served as a deputy district attorney pro tem for the Santa Barbara County District Attorney's Office where she prosecuted misdemeanors. Hernandez earned her Juris Doctor degree at the Thurgood Marshall School of Law at Texas Southern University where she worked as an intern for the Harris County District Attorney's Office. She earned her Bachelor of Arts in Sociology from UCLA.

Hernandez has been assigned to the Criminal Law Division and she will preside in Department 47 at the Hall of Justice in Ventura. The date of her formal installation ceremony will be announced in the near future.

The ListServe is intended to facilitate communication among its members by providing an opportunity to post a query on a substantive or procedural issue. Once you send an email, every member on that specific list will receive the message. To protect the ListServe participants from spam or other unwanted solicitation, you can only send messages using the email in your VCBA Profile. Otherwise, it will automatically be rejected. Members are automatically added based off your Areas of Practice and VCBA Sections you belong to. If you do not belong to that group email, the system will not allow you to use it.


